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In the Hoop Wine Glass Coasters



General Supply List:

Embroidery machine: minimum hoop size 140mm x 225mm Coaster Embroidery Design Rotary Cutter, Mat, Ruler Scissors Shears and Thread Snips Iron and ironing surface Fabric Marker of your choice (pen, pencil, chalk...) Microtex size 80 or 90 needle or your favorite needle for embroidery. General Sewing Supplies

Supply List for Wine Glass Coasters:

Project Supplies:

Four 5" squares of fabric
Fusible Web
Nylon or polyester organza large enough to be hooped in your hoop
No show mesh stabilizer large enough to be hooped in your hoop
Clear "topper" stabilizer that melts away with the heat from your iron
or a water soluble clear topper.
Bobbin wound with embroidery thread to match the top thread
Mini Iron (optional)
Heat Tool

Painters tape







In the Hoop Wine Glass Coasters

NOTE: These directions are to be used in conjunction with the videos.

Instructions:

Cut Four 5" squares of fabric

Top of Coaster: Two 5" squares of fabric. 1/2 of the square has fusible web on the back. Middle layer of Coaster: One 5" square of fabric with fusible web on the back Back of Coaster: One 5" square of fabric with fusible web on the back

Remove the protective paper from the fusible web

Fold the two pieces of fabric for the top of the coaster in half and iron.

(They will now be 2 1/2" x 5")

Hoop one layer of nylon or polyester organza on top of one layer of no show mesh. Set up your embroidery machine with matching embroidery thread in the needle and the bobbin. Stitch Color I (This is the outline stitch to indicate where your fabric should go) Place the Coaster Bottom fabric UNDER the hoop Wrong Side touching no show mesh.

THIS IS NOT SHOWN IN THE VIDEO, BUT IS VERY IMPORTANT IN DOING THIS PROJECT: Remove the hoop from the machine.

Do NOT remove the project from the hoop.

Use the painters TAPE to hold the fabric to the back.

Wrong side of the fabric touching the no show mesh stabilizer.

The right side of the fabric will touch the feed dogs.

Makie sure that the outline stitch is completely covered by the fabric.

Attach the hoop to the machine.

Place the middle coaster fabric on top of the sheer organza wrong side of the fabric touching the organza making sure the outline stitches are completely covered.

Place the folded fabric on top of the middle fabric, folded edges to the center and lined up with the center marks that were embroidered.

THIS IS NOT SHOWN IN THE VIDEO, BUT IS VERY IMPORTANT IN DOING THIS PROJECT: Use painters tape to hold all this in place. One piece of tape running down the folded edges of the fabric will make sure that the foot does not get caught in the fabric and will lightly hold everything in place.

Even with this you will need to watch this carefully and gently hold in place. Slow your machine down if possible.

Stitch color two.

Remove the hoop from the embroidery machine, but do not remove the project from the hoop. Remove the painters tape.

Cut away the excess fabric from the back close to the stitches.

Cut away the excess fabric from the front close to the stitches

Remove the "center line up stitches" theta are extending beyond your fabric circle.

Press with the mini iron.

Put the hoop back on the machine.

Place the clear topper stabilizer over the project

Stitch the next color (this will baste the topper in place)

Slow your machine down if possible and

hold the topper in place as the basting stitch is stitched.

Continue stitching until embroidery is complete.

Use the heat tool to remove the excess organza and no show mesh. Remove the clear topper stabilizer.
