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## Dinner with Santa

### General Supply List:

Rotary Cutter, Mat, Ruler

Scissors

Shears and Thread Snips

Iron and ironing surface

Fabric Marker of your choice (pen, pencil, chalk...)

Microtex size 80 or 90 needle or your favorite needle.

Machine Feet: 1/4" foot

Construction Thread

Decorative Thread

General Sewing Supplies

### Supply List for Mug Rug:

Project Supplies:

Front: 8" x 10" piece of fabric with batting fused to the back

Back: 8" x 10" piece of fabric

Lining: Two 8" x 10" pieces of fabric

Trim for top of stocking: 12"

1/4" foot

Pinking Shears

Template Stocking

Fabric Tac Glue

Cut Away Stabilizer

Embroidery Design for design on stocking.

## Dinner with Santa

### Instructions:

Gather all the supplies listed on the previous page.

Fuse Batting to the back of the front fabric.

Hoop Cut away stabilizer.

The design is composed of lots of little diamonds and we don't want to have to try and remove these after we have finished the embroidery design so we are using a cut away stabilizer that can just be left in our project.

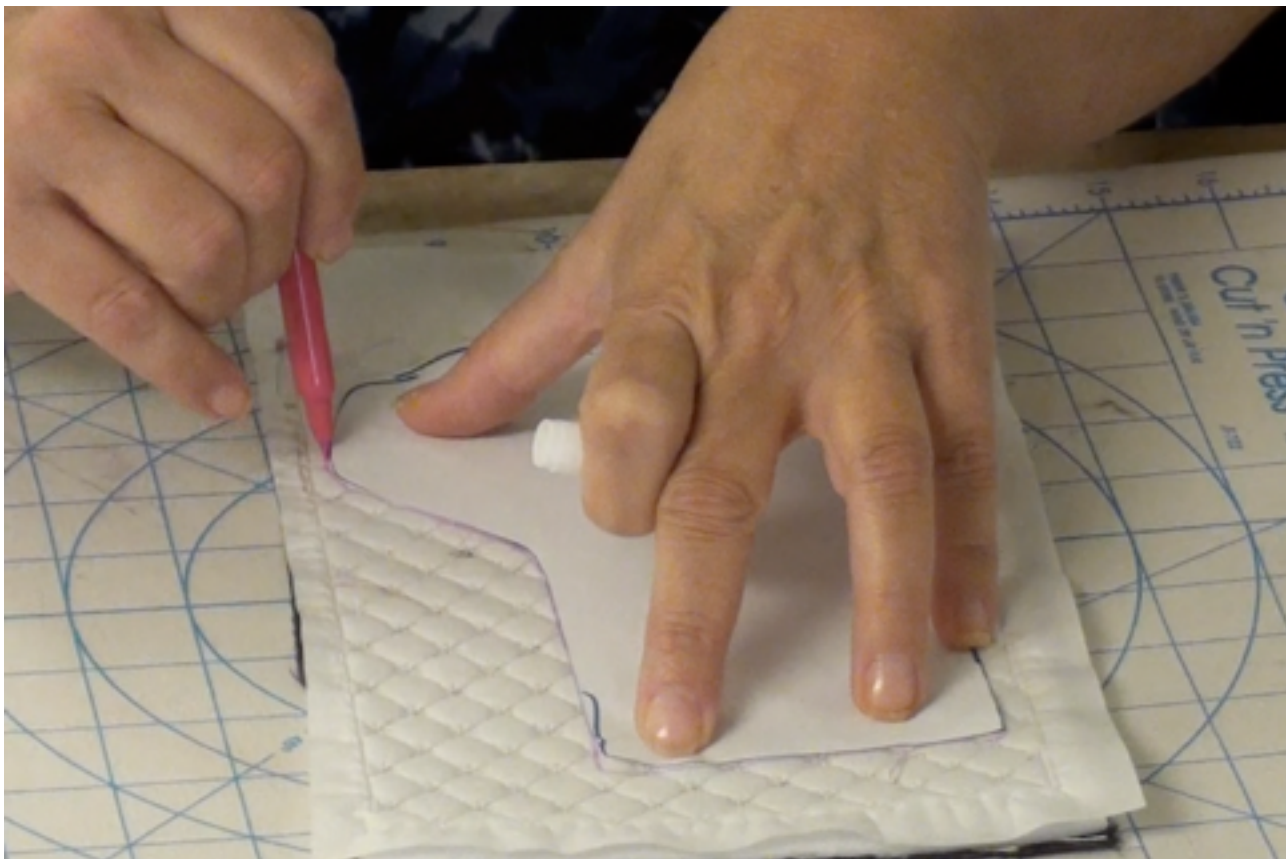
Call up the background design.

Place the front fabric (fused with batting) on top of the cut away stabilizer, baste in place, then stitch out the entire design.

Place the front fabric (that has been embroidered) and the back fabric Right Sides Together (RST).

Using the template, trace the stocking onto the project, then cut out.

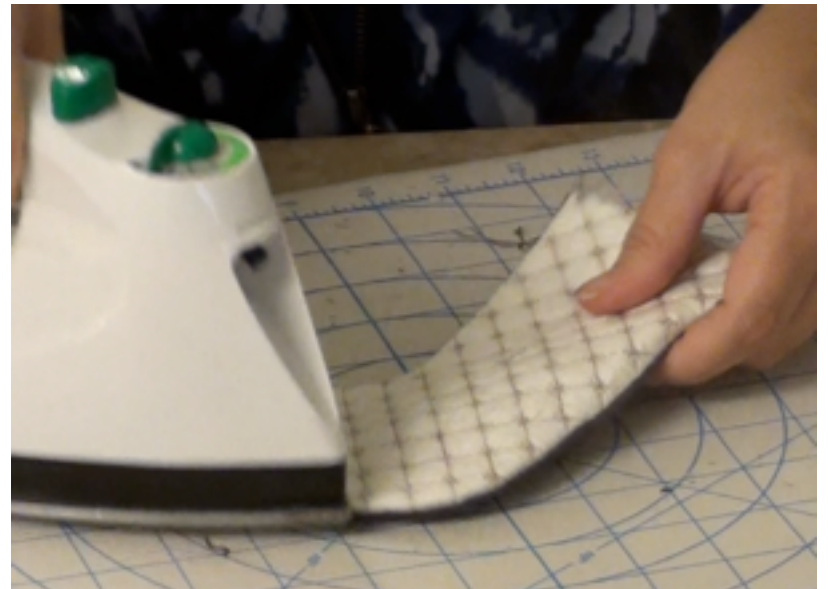
Repeat the tracing and cutting for the lining fabrics.







## Dinner with Santa



Using a 1/4" seam stitch the stocking front to the back. (RST)

Leave the top of the stocking open.

Using a 1/4" seam stitch the linings together. (RST)

Leave the top of the stocking open AND leave a 3" opening at the bottom for turning your project Right Side Out (RSO)

Use Pinking Shears to trim the seam allowances on the stocking and the lining.

Do not trim the top or the 3" opening.

Turn Stocking RSO and press well.

Leave lining RST

Place stocking inside the lining RST

Stitch around the top edge with a 1/4" seam.

Turn project Right Side Out through the opening in the lining.

Press the entire project well.

Press the seam in at the opening and stitch this area closed.



This is how your stocking will look when you have stitched the top together and turned it RSO through the opening in the lining. You now see the Right Side of the stocking and the Right Side of the lining, joined at the top. It is at this point that I stitched the opening used for turning closed.







## Dinner with Santa

Tuck lining inside the stocking.

Press the top edge well.

Glue trim to the top with fabric tac glue.

To insert the napkin easily into the stocking:

Find the center of your napkin.

Place the handle of your knife at the center and wrap the napkin around it.

Push the knife and the napkin into the stocking.

Insert silverware.
