Fall Placemats

Supply List:

Embroidery Machine with a minimum hoop size of 120mm x 120mm Software and transfer device to load the designs Fall Pumpkin Design by Margaret Moorehead Rotary Cutter, Mat, Ruler, Quilters Square Scissors

Shears and Thread Snips Iron and ironing surface

Fabric Marker of your choice (pen, pencil, chalk...)

General Sewing Supplies

Microtex size 80 or 90 needle or your favorite needle for embroidery and decorative stitches.

Machine Feet (These are recommended but not required)

Stitch in the ditch (edge guide foot, lace join foot, it has many names)

Quarter inch foot with a guide

Bias Binding Foot/Attachment (optional)

Tape (I like painters tape)

School Glue (Like Elmer's)

Embroidery Thread

Construction Thread

Bobbins for embroidery and construction

Sticky tear away stabilizer for embroidery

Monofilament thread

Project Supplies:

Center Fabric: 13" x 17" fused with batting

Border and Backing Fabric: 17" x 21" fused with batting

Binding Fabric: Be sure to cut on Bias

If using your binding foot cut the width that is recommended for your foot.

If not using the binding foot cut your fabric 1 1/2" wide

You will ned 2 pieces about 26" long and 2 pieces about 22" long

Fall Placemats

Be sure to refer to the videos as you create these wonderful Fall Placemats

Fuse the batting to the center fabric

Fuse the batting to the backing/border fabric

Mark the center fabric at the exact horizontal and vertical center (mark on right side)

Mark the center fabric for your embroidery (mark on right side)

4.5" up from the bottom right corner and 4.5" in from the right hand side

Mark the backing/border fabric at the exact horizontal and vertical center

(mark on batting side)

Hoop the sticky stabilizer and embroider the design on the center fabric

Remove the project from the hoop

Remove the excess stabilizer

Trim threads

Press

Attach the bias binding to all 4 sides of the backing/border fabric.

Choose the method you prefer from the videos.

Cut the backing/border fabric corners following the video directions

Stitch the corners using a 1/4" seam

Trim the corners

Press the corner seams open

Turn right side out and press the "border" in place

Trim the center piece if necessary

(remember to trim the sides that are NOT near the embroidery)

Insert the center piece

Stitch in the ditch next to the binding to hold the center piece in place

Press

Enjoy!
