Royal Garter




Supply List:

- * Lace
- * Elastic (Ruched elastic is nice)
- * Sewing thread in the needle and bobbin
- * Size 90 sharp needle
- * Crystals and wand (optional)

Equipment List:

- * Sewing Machine in good working order
- * Sharp Scissors
- * Free motion foot
- * Open Toe Foot
- * General Sewing Supplies

Royal Garter

These garters can be made from purchased lace, lace from a loved ones wedding dress or any other lace you choose.

Be creative and enjoy the process!

Royal Garter

Lace and Elastic	Quantity	size	prep
Rouched Elastic	1	Width of your choice (I used 1/2") Length 14"-18"	
Lace	Varies	Small pieces of lace	Cut into individual pieces



Ready, Set, GO!

Most lace is made so that it can be cut apart without raveling. Do a test on the lace you are going to be using and make sure it can be cut apart and it will still look the way you want it to.

Each lace will be different. Look at the lace and decide how you want to cut it apart.

Arrange the cut apart pieces in a pleasing manner. Try several different arrangements to get the look that you want.

HINT: Take a picture of the arrangements you think you might like to use so you can recreate them.



Refer to the video to see exactly how I stitched my lace together.

Royal Garter





Stitching can be done with the feed dogs up or free motion with the feed dogs lowered.

Pick up the first two pieces of lace and stitch them together using the method of your choice. (Refer to the video for more details)

Continue stitching lace pieces together until all of them are attached.

Stitch the combined lace to the ruched elastic.

Add crystals if desired,





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
