

Wonderful Wallets

These wallets can be done in any size you want. The "cut down to" sizes of mine are as follows:

Gold and red: 6 1/2" x 10" Pink and white: 8" x 10" Pink and white: 6" x 10"

Black and white: (in the hoop embroidery) 8" x 9"

Supplies:

Outside of wallet fabric fused with Quilt Magic cut 2" longer and 2" wider then "cut down to" size

Inside (lining) of wallet cut 2" longer and 2" wider then the "cut down to" size Accent strip of fabric fused with fusible web for NOT in the hoop wallet:

1 1/2" wide by length of fabric fused with guilt magic

Accent strip of fabric fused with fusible web for IN the hoop embroidery:

3" wide by length of fabric fused with Jenny's Quilt Magic

Binding fabric 2" x 42" if doing a smaller wallet you will need less then 43" Rotary Cutter, Mat and Ruler

Decorative stitch or open toe foot

Scissors

Tear away stabilizer

Sticky Tear away stabilizer (for wallet with IN the hoop embroidery)

NOT in the hoop embroidery wallet

Fuse the accent strip to the fabric with the fusible web making sure it is straight and centered going length wise on the fabric

Stitch a decorative stitch over each raw edge being sure you have tear away stabilizer behind your stitches

Remove stabilizer from the back

Stitch a decorative stitch down the center of the accent strip, again being sure that you have stabilizer behind your stitches

Remove the stabilizer from the back

Repeat until you have as many rows of stitching as you want

Construction:

Use spray adhesive to attach the lining piece to the back of your front

Trace the curves and cut all layers at one time to the desired size

Press into thirds (fold 3" -3 1/2" up from the bottom, and top curved edge will be folded down about 2" - 2 1/2" ...make it look pleasing to you)

Attach bias to straight edge of the folded up part of the wallet

Have same thread in bobbin as in needle

Stitch wrong side of the project to right side of bias with about 1/2 seam

Press how you stitched it

Press bias up and then over the front

Stitch in the ditch from the back

Cut off excess bias

Cover raw edge with decorative stitch

With wallet folded in the finished position attach the bias around all the raw edges (two sides and the curved top edge) being sure to fold up the ends so you have nice finished edges on your bias)

IN the hoop embroidery wallet

Hoop sticky tear away stabilizer and remove protective paper Center your fabric with the batting fused to the back under the needle Baste your project in place

Stitch the first color...this is the outline of where to put the accent strip of fabric Lay down the accent piece of fabric (that has fusible web on the back) Stitch color 2 to hold this fabric in place

Remove the hoop from the machine and cut away the excess fabric CUT **VERY** close to the stitching...the stitch to cover the raw edge is not very wide....

Continue stitching until the design is complete

Follow the construction steps listed above to complete this project.
