






# Stabilizing Knit and Lightweight Fabrics

Tip: We are using water soluble stabilizer so we need to be sure the fabric will not shrink when the stabilizer is washed out.
Cut a square of the fabric and a piece of paper at the same time.
Once the fabric is washed and dried place the fabric back on the paper to see if it is still the same size as the paper.


# Stabilizing Knit and Lightweight Fabrics



Cut a piece of water soluble stabilizer large enough to be easily hooped. To do this just place the inner part of your hoop on top of the stabilizer and then cut it to the needed size as in the photo

On the stabilizer side, not the protective paper side trace the inside of the hoop.





The stabilizer is sticky and sometimes a bit tricky to work with, so here is a little tip: Expose one narrow strip of the sticky stabilizer and place one of your rulers on the edge to to hold the stabilizer in place then remove the rest of the protective paper by peeling it back.


Note: You may not need to do this....but just in case you do....keep it in mind.

You should be able to see the outline of the inside of your hoop. Mine did not show up in the photos so I have enhanced it here so it is visible on the screen. This allows you to see where to put your fabric so it will be hooped nicely.

# Place your fabric right side up on the sticky stabilizer and gently smooth it into place

# Beautiful flat embroidery!

Cut away excess water soluble stabilizer.


Rinse out the remaining water soluble stabilizer according to the manufacturer's instructions

Hint: If you have residue from the stabilizer remaining in your fabric, you can add some fabric softener to the water.












Once the stabilizer is rinsed out of the project, press it to bring back that wonderful flat embroidery



What if you have the softest, "drapiest", lightest, most beautiful, hardest to work with fabric ever made????



### No problem....we just add a few more steps to the process....





Add a piece of water soluble sticky stabilizer to the top also!




Stitch Rinse Press





2 layers water soluble stabilizer (not sticky) with organza sandwiched between

Stitch Trim threads

Remove excess organza and stabilizer with a heat tool

Rinse Dry Iron










# \*\*\*\*Creating the Scarf\*\*\*\*



Fabric sizes 18" x 20" 18"wide x 45"-60" long

Stabilize Fabric
Call up design
Stitch
Rinse
Iron if needed when dry

#### Special Announcement

I lied during the webinar....not intentionally though, so I want to correct it now. The TOTAL length of the scarves went up to 72 inches not just 60 inches.

For my scarves I added a piece of fabric that was 18" x 60" to the embroidered fabric so the total length of my scarf was about 72"

Sorry for the error....now back to our program!

### \*\*\*\*Creating the Scarf\*\*\*\*







### \*\*\*\*Creating the Scarf\*\*\*\*





Fold in half long ways, right sides together

Line up the top and bottom edges, and where the embroidery meets the other fabric

Pin together.


When you stitch you will leave an opening large enough for your hand to fit in.

I mark the opening with 2 pins to remind me to start and stop there

Stitch long side leaving the opening.















#### General Knit tips:

If you fabric is rolling you can try starching it.

Use a narrow zig zag to allow stretch in your seams.

Twin needles are great for knits (they allow stretching also)



If needed stabilize your fabric with water soluble sticky stabilizer

Draw a line down the center of the project (on the stabilizer side if you have stabilized) to help with lining up the designs



Hoop sticky stabilizer and remove the protective paper

Place your fabric on the stabilizer and baste fabric to in place.


Stitch out design and placement marks





Remove excess stabilizer that was in the hoop from the project.

Hoop another piece of stabilizer in the hoop



Look at the design and see exactly where your needle is going to stitch on the placement points



Line up the already stitched out design so the placement marks will stitch out exactly on top of the previously stitched placement marks

Just line up the first one at this time and stitch it.



Now line up the second placement point and stitch it (again being sure you know exactly what part of the placement point the needle is located at right now)

Continue for the third placement point

Smooth your project out and press it so it will stick to the stabilizer.

Then go back to the beginning and baste your project in place if possible



Repeat until your project is complete.
