Embroidery

Center Medallion

NOTE: All embroidery designs will fit a minimum 140mm x 225mm hoop. Should you have a larger hoop then we suggest you combine as many designs as you can in one hoop area prior to embroidery. This saves time, fabric and stabilizer.

Block 1



Center Medallion

Block 1



Embroider designs ble1 and ble2 over organza and Dissolve Magic. Then use the Magic Heat Cutting tool to burn around the edge of the three roses and three sets of leaves. Wash the designs and let them dry.

Block 1



Cut out three small circles of *Quilt Magic* the size of the rose 'bowl' and then press these circles to the back of the rose 'bowl'.

Block 1



Place the embroidered roses over *Quilt Magic* and use the fabric-marking pen to trace around the outside of them. Use small sharp scissors to cut out the traced rose outline, $\frac{3}{8}$ in inside the line. Press the *Quilt Magic* rose shapes to the back of the three embroidered roses.

Center Medallion

Block 1



Use the photo as a guide to arrange the three roses in the center of Block No1 and then place the three sets of leaves, evenly under and around the roses.

Block 1



Use a little fabric glue on the back of the leaves to lightly secure them in place. Use the clear-view open-toe freehand foot, a straight stitch and *Invisa* sheer thread in the needle and thread that matches the backing fabric in the bobbin. Sew a tiny freehand stipple-stitch around the outside edge of the leaves to secure them in place. Also stitch down the veins of the leaves.

Center Medallion

Block 1



Position the three roses over the leaves and repeat previous step to stitch the roses in place. Also stitch between the rose petals and around the rose 'bowl'.

Block 1



Use a little glue to secure the center of the ribbon length under the roses. Use the bar-tack stitch to sew the flat ribbon to the block and then tie in a bow.

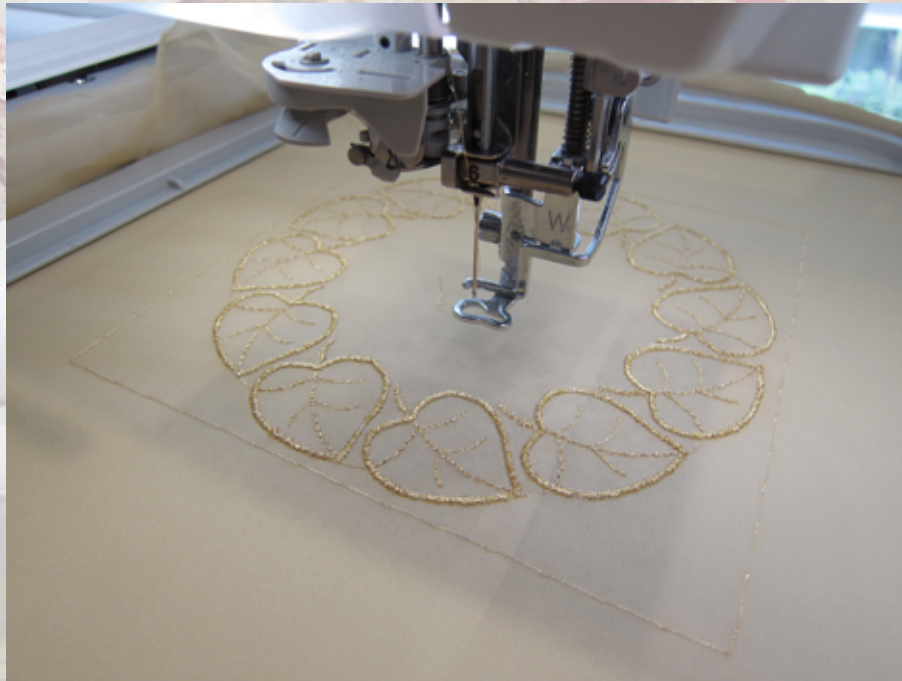
Center Medallion

Block 2

- This design is embroidered using Jenny's *Embroidered Applique Decoupage*® technique.
- Sandwich fabric No11 (nylon organza) between two layers of *Dissolve Magic* – hoop these three layers.
- Embroider one design *ble2* circular applique design.

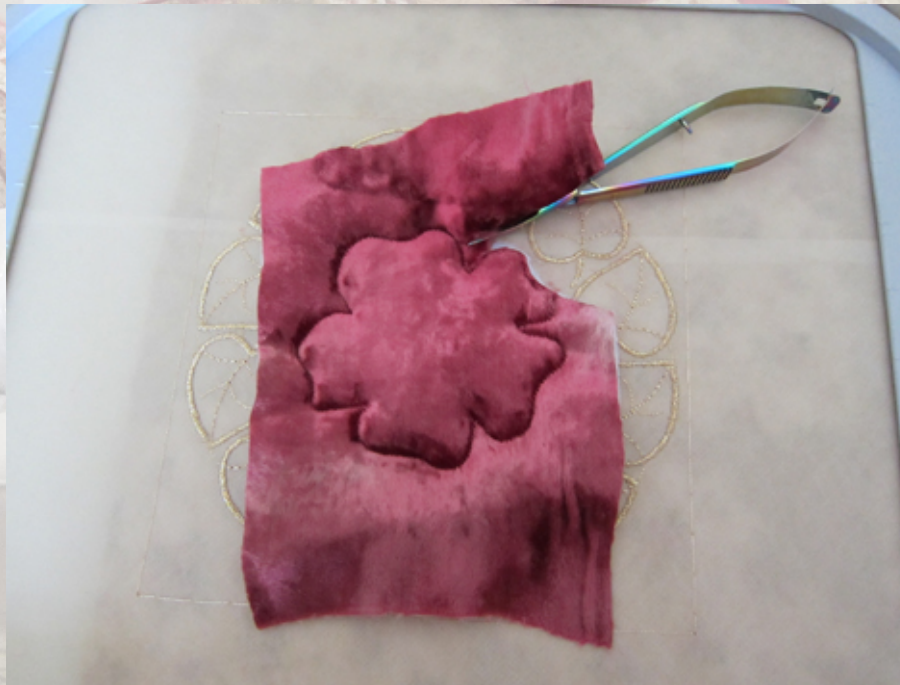
Block 2



- Embroider the first color of the design – circular leaves.
- Iron *Sheer Magic Plus* to the back of the velvet applique insert fabric and then *Quilt Magic* to the back of the *Sheer Magic Plus*.

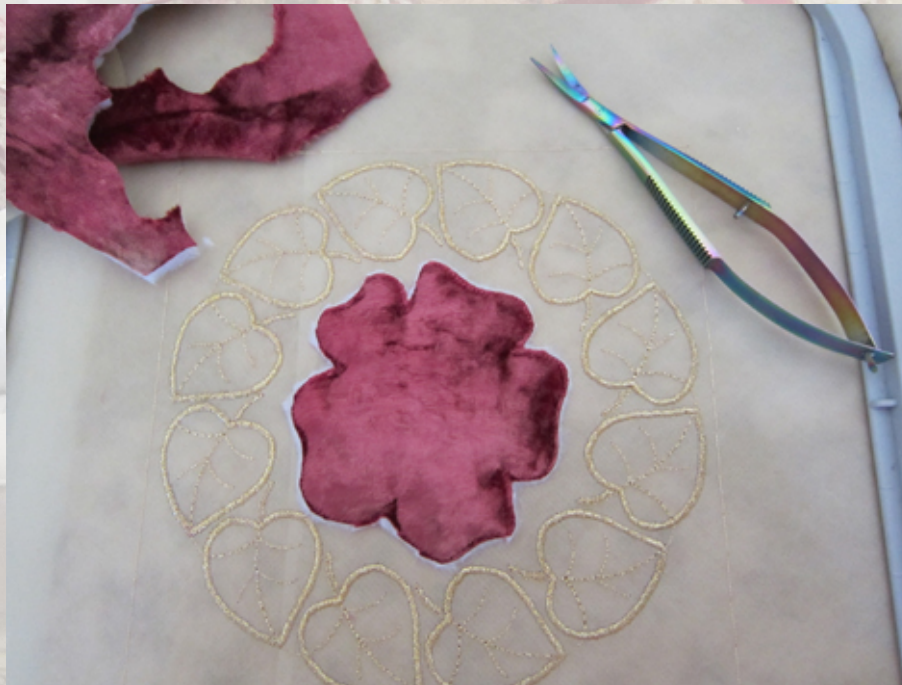
Block 2



Stitch the center flower outline and then place the applique fabric over the outline and stitch the flower outline again.

Center Medallion

Block 2



Remove the hoop from the machine, not the fabric from the hoop and then use small sharp scissors to cut the applique fabric, close to and following the flower outline stitching.

Block 2



Finish stitching the design, burn around the edge of the design with the Magic Heat Cutting tool and wash to remove the Dissolve Magic, dry and press.

Block 2



Position the embroidery centered over the center square of Block No2. Gather up the 2yd x 1in edging lace and then place this under the outside edge of the circular design. (Left over lace will be used in the key board border designs.)

Center Medallion

Block 2



Use a fabric-marking pen to mark a circle, $1/2$ in smaller in diameter than the embroidery design, centered in the center square of the block.

Center Medallion

Block 2



Lightly trace glue around the marked circle and then arrange the gathered lace around the circle, (gathered straight edge of the lace should follow the marked circle) turn under the two cut ends of the lace, and then finger press the lace to the glue.

Block 2



Center the embroidery over the lace and secure it in place with a small amount of glue in the center of the applique flower. Pin the circular edge of the design making sure it sits over the gathered lace in an even circle. Stitch in place with Invisa thread.

Glue a suitable 3/4in diameter sparkly button to the center of the applique flower.

Center Medallion

Block 3



Embroider one, *ble3* flat flower and one, *ble1a* free standing flower petals.

Block 3



Embroider one, *ble3b* leaves.

Center Medallion

Block 3



Remove the hoop from the machine, not the fabric from the hoop. Place the hoop over a glass cutting board and then use the *Magic Heat Cutting* tool to heat-cut each design out.

Center Medallion

Block 3



Place the flat flower and the three leaves over *Quilt Magic* and then use the fabric-marking pen to trace around the outside of them. Use small sharp scissors to cut out the traced flower and leaves outline, $3/8$ in inside the line.

Block 3



Press the *Quilt Magic* shapes to the back of the embroidered flat flower and three leaves.

Block 3



Use the photo as a guide to arrange the flat flower in the center of Block No3 and then place the three leaves, evenly under and around the flower.

Block 3



Use a little fabric glue on the back of the leaves to lightly secure them in place. Use *Invisa* sheer thread to sew the leaves in place.

Block 3



Repeat for the large flower.

Center Medallion

Block 3



Use the pattern and fabric No12 to cut out 6-8 organza petals. Use the hand sewing needle to gather up the base of the petals.

Block 3



Pinch up the base of the free-standing petals, securing the 'pinch' with glue and holding the pinch until the glue dries with clothes pins (pegs).

Center Medallion

Block 3



Arrange the organza petals around the center of the flower in the center of the block and then glue them in place. Use the leg of a chair in the center only, to hold them secure until the glue is dry.

Block 3



Arrange then glue the ‘pinched’ embroidered petals over the organza ones using the photo as a guide. Again use the leg of a chair in the center only to hold them secure until the glue is dry.

Block 3



Glue the center of the flower over the center of the flower and petals, securing it in place with the leg of a chair until the glue is dry.

Center Medallion

Block 3



In doing this the center of the flower is flattened and the organza and embroidered petals 'puff' out from under the center of the flower. Use the *Magic Rhinestone Setter* to add heat-activated crystals to the center of the flower for the final touch.

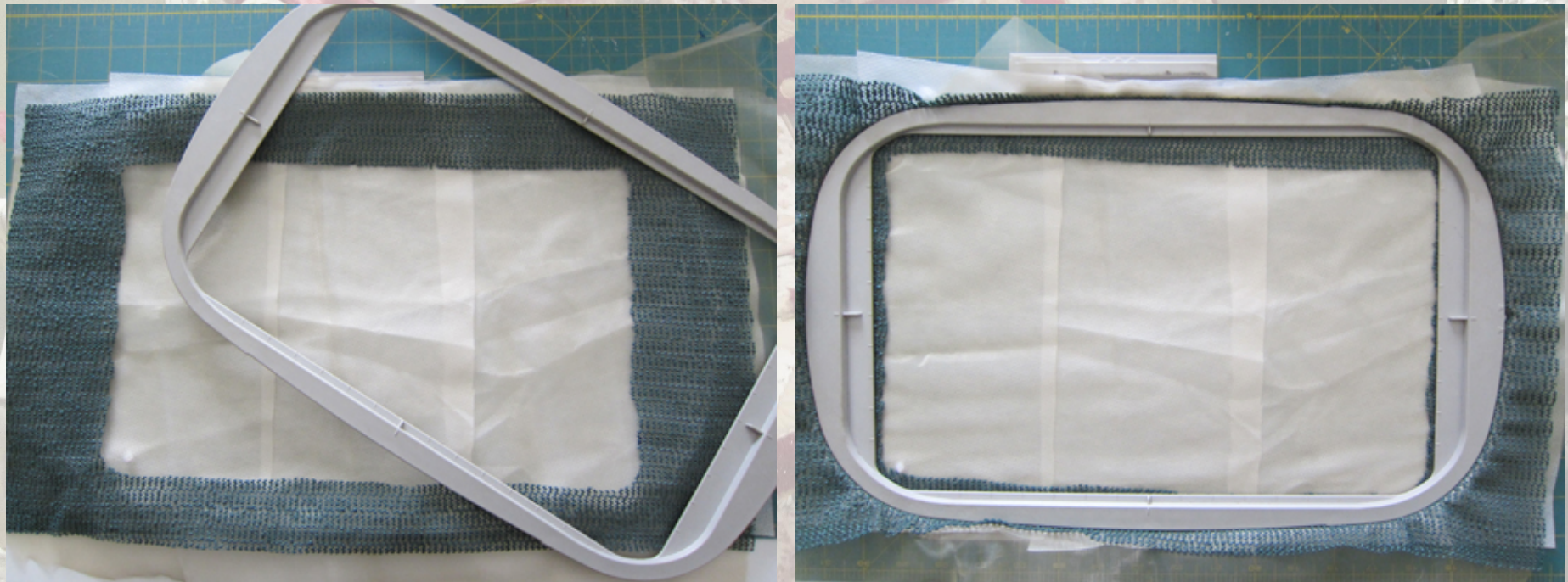

Block 4

Block 4



Hoop *Cutaway Magic* and fabric No11 (nylon organza) using the 'Grip it' frame on top of the organza.

Block 4



Layer *Krinkle Magic*, *Quilt Magic* and then velvet fabric in the hoop to embroider design *Krinkle* a grid quilted design. Take out of hoop and steam.

Block 4



Embroider one design *ble4* flower, over *Cutaway Magic* and organza using fabric No6 as the applique fabric insert for the lower petals, crinkled velvet as the fabric insert for the upper petals and fabric No6 as the fabric insert for the center of the flower. Do not stitch the final color of the design – the circular stitching around the inside of the flower center.

Center Medallion

Block 4



Cut a circular piece of *Quilt Magic* to back the center of the flower. Turn the flower upside down, and then iron the circle of *Quilt Magic* to the center of the flower.

Block 4



Use Invisa thread to applique the embroideries to the block.

Block 4



Glue a suitable 3/4in diameter sparkly button to the center of the applique flower.
