

Tools/Materials

Tools:

- 4x4 hoop or similar
- Embroidery needle 75/11
- Embroidery thread to match
- Rotary Cutter, mat, ruler
- Fabric sheers
- 5" craft scissors
- Clear tape
- Hammer
- Eyelet hammer set
- Eyelet setter pliers (optional)
- Extra paper or tear away stabilizer
- Fabric paint (I used 3D Fabric paint)
- Fine, small paint brush
- Q-Tip (instead of the paint brush)
- Jewelry making pliers or similar



Materials:

- Tear away stabilizer to fit hoop
- Cork - Front 3"x3"
- Cork - Back 3"x3"
- (3) 5/32" metal eyelets (1 necklace-2 earrings)
- (2) Earring hooks
- (2) Small jump rings
- (3) Large jump rings for earrings and necklace

NOTE:

Scissor Design was used as the example - all Cork Jewelry have the same basic steps.

Designs come in three different ways: Earrings, Necklace or Set. In these instructions the Set was demonstrated.

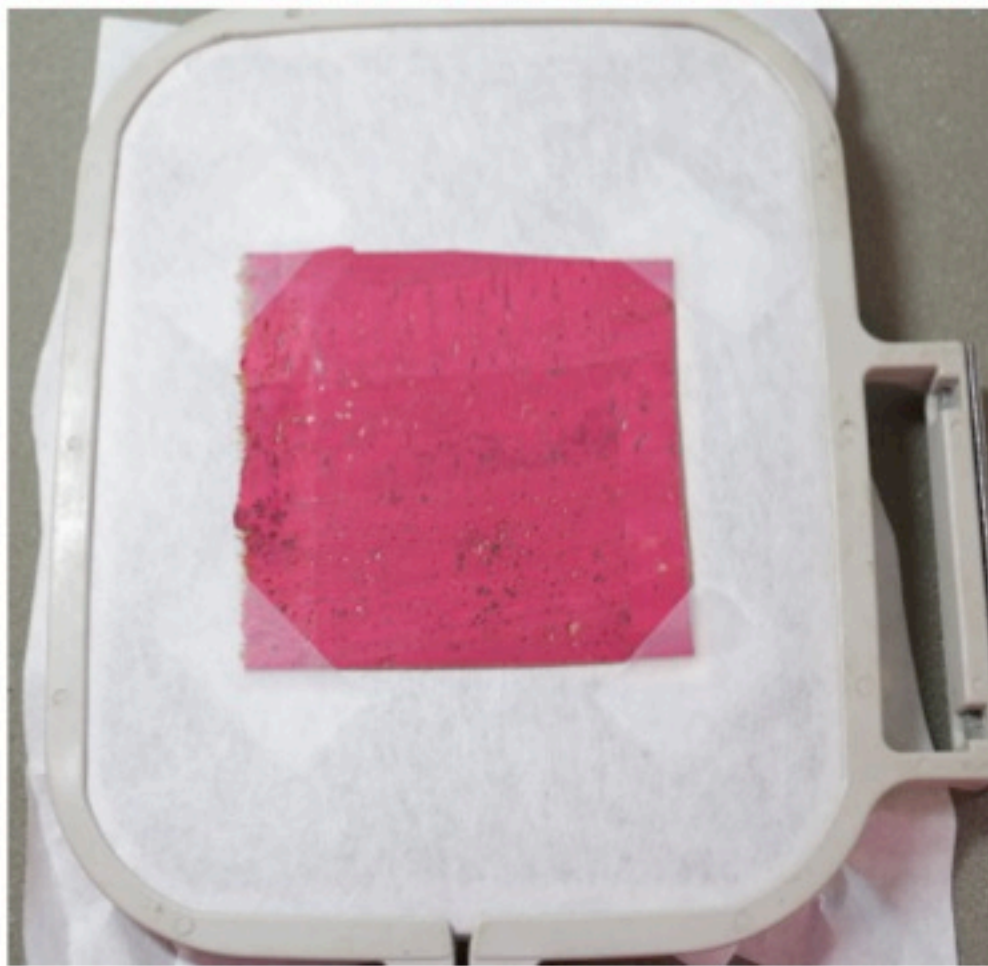
1. Thread machine with matching bobbin. Hoop tear away stabilizer. Insert hoop into machine and sew **Stitch #1**, placement stitch.



2. Remove hoop from machine and place on a flat surface. Place the Front material covering the stitching and secure in place with clear tape.



3. Turn hoop to Wrong Side.
Place the Back piece of material
covering the stitching. Secure
with clear tape.



4. Insert hoop into machine and
sew Stitch #2, detail stitches.



5. Remove stabilizer from hoop and materials from stabilizer.



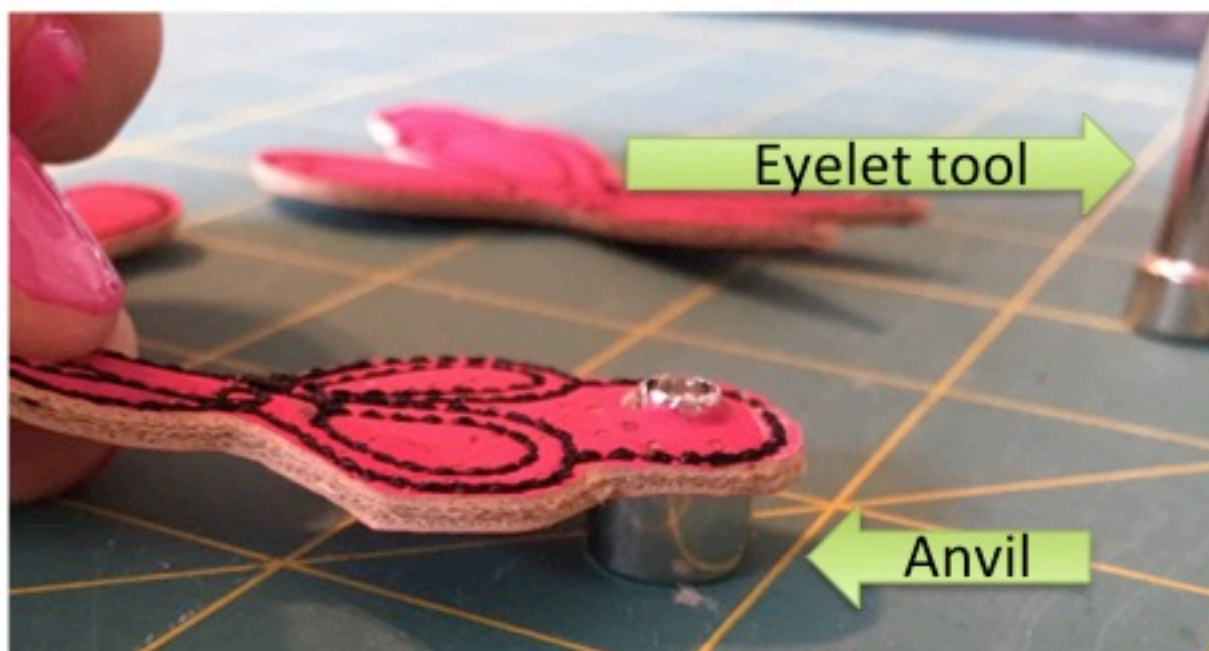
6. Using a small sharp pair of scissors or 5" craft scissors, cut around outside stitching. Leave about 1/16"-1/8" around outside stitching.



7. Press an eyelet post into the empty space on each piece (2 earrings – 1 necklace). This will leave an imprint. Use sharp scissors to cut away all layers of material inside the imprinted area, leaving a hole.



8. Insert eyelet into hole from Front to Back. Position eyelet cap on anvil, insert tool into eyelet and hammer gently. Center of eyelet will split to secure eyelet.



NOTE: You can also use an eyelet setter pliers

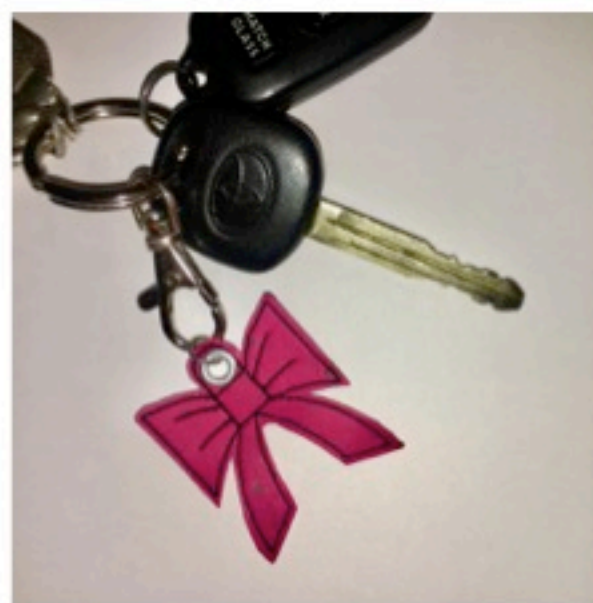


9. Use fabric paint along the edge of the pieces. Pick up a small amount of paint onto small paint brush and gently apply to edges. **NOTE:** A Q-Tip works well too.



10. Insert a Large jump ring into each eyelet. Then a small jump ring into the (2) large earring jump rings. Insert the earring hooks into the (2) small jump rings. Use desired necklace.





What else can you do with these?

- Charms
- Key Chains
- Scissor fobs
- Wine glass markers
