

Let's Get Started!

Gather your supplies...

- Fat Quarter Cotton Fabric for outside and lining
- Fat Quarter Cotton Fabric for inside pockets
- Fusible Webbing
- Fusible Woven Cotton Interfacing
- 2/3 yard of 7/8" wide Pickle Pie Designs Grosgrain Ribbon
- Permanent Seam Tape
- Cutaway stabilizer

A few notes before you begin...

- All sizes listed are width x length
- Two design sizes are included so those with 5x7 hoops can join in. The 5x7 size is only slightly smaller than the 6x10 size and the major difference is that the finished 5x7 hoop size will hold Tea Bags horizontally, while the larger size will hold them either horizontally or vertically.

Design info...

- **Small**
Hoop size 5x7 or larger
Design size: " x "
- **Large**
Hoop size 6x10 or larger
Design Size: 3.8" x 7.5"

Prepare your materials...

Cut your fabric....

For:	Label:	Large	Medium
Outside	A	5" x 9"	5" x 8.5"
Pocket 1	B	5" x 7"	5" x 6"
Pocket 2	C	5" x 7"	5" x 6"
Lining	D	5" x 9"	5" x 8.5"

Cut fusible webbing....

- Cut two pieces to 5" x 3"

Cut fusible interfacing....

- Cut two pieces to 5" x 8.5"

Cut the ribbon....

- Cut two 12" pieces


Prep your materials...

- Fold Fabrics B & C, wrong sides together, to 5" x 3.5" for the large or 5" x 3" for the medium. Press with an iron to crease.
- Remove the paper backing from one side of the fusible webbing. Slide it against the inner fold of Fabric B. Press, following manufacturer's instructions. Remove the remaining paper, close the folded fabric and press to fuse. Repeat with Fabric C.
- Press the fusible interfacings to the wrong side of Fabrics A and D.

Get Ready to Stitch...

Hoop a piece of stabilizer, place the hoop on your machine & let's have some fun!

1. Using thread to match your main fabric, sew Stitch Sequence 1 directly on your stabilizer to create a placement line for your fabric.



2. Center one large piece of fabric over the placement line. Tape in place. Sew Stitch Sequence 2 to tack down the fabric.



3. Sew Stitch Sequence 3 to create three horizontal placement lines. The photo shows these lines numbered for easy placement in subsequent steps.



4. Center one piece ribbon over Placement Line 1. 1/2" of the ribbon should lie outside the placement line, with the rest of the length across the project, as shown.



5. Center Fabric B over the top of the project with the fold toward the center. Align the fold just above placement lines 2 and 3, as shown. Tape in place along the edges.



Sew Stitch Sequence 4 to tack down Fabric B.

6. Fold up the length of the ribbon a couple of times and tape it down over Fabric B, keeping it at least 1/2" from the stitch line at the top of the project.



7. Sew Stitch Sequence 5 to create three horizontal placement lines. The photo shows these lines numbered for easy placement in subsequent steps.



8. Center the remaining length of ribbon over Placement Line 4. 1/2" of the ribbon should lie outside the placement line, with the rest of the length across the project, as shown.




9. Center Fabric C over the bottom of the project with the fold toward the center. Align the fold just above placement lines 5 and 6, as shown. Tape in place along the edges.




Sew Stitch Sequence 6 to tack down Fabric B.

10. Fold down the length of the ribbon and tape it down, keeping it at least 1/2" from the stitch line at the bottom of the project.



11. Center Fabric D, right side down, over the project, being sure to cover all the stitch lines. Tape in place.

Sew Stitch Sequence 7 to complete the stitching.



12. Remove the project from the Hoop. Trim away the cutaway stabilizer, right up to the stitch line, being careful not to cut through the stitches, then trim around the project, leaving a 1/4" - 1/2" seam allowance. Clip the corners.



13. Turn the project right side out through the opening on one end, poking out the corners well.

Turn in the open end and use seam tape to close it, following manufacturer's instructions.



14. Turn the pockets to the other side, then press your Tea Bag Holder to finish.



14. Insert your tea bags inside and tie in a bow for the finishing touch!
