


"Prep" your fabric by fusing a light weight interfacing to the back of the fabric. Choose an interfacing that will not change the main characteristics of the fabric.. This increases the number of stitches piece of fabric can hold. THEN stabilize as you normally would.



- Floating Stabilizer
- Hoop only your stabilizer and baste the fabric in place







- Plain
- Sticky
- Fusible
- Water Activated
- Different Weights


- Tears Away Easily
- Can "float" extra piece for more stabilization
- Plain tear away usually the most economical
- Can be hooped with the project, or you can hoop the stabilizer and baste the project to the tear away



Cut Away







- Stays in your project forever
- Commonly used when embroidering on knits
- Great for loosely woven and light weight fabrics
- Cut away excess leaving about 1/2" all the way around and rounding the corners.
- Great or free standing embroidery

- Plain
- Mesh
- Fusible Mesh





- Water soluble topper (plastic like)
- Plain Water Soluble Stabilizer
- Sticky Water Soluble Stabilizer
- Completely rinses away with water

- Great for lace and cutwork
- Use when working on see through fabrics
- Project must be washable
- Wonderful for crochet lace edges
- Cut away excess, never tear it away
- If there is residue remaining try a fabric softener











Stitch Embroidery Design 2 times (Front and Back) If desired, embroider a design on the lining Cut out along outer most line of embroidered design Press




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Tailor







Transfer marks to lining if necessary

Stitch from corner to mark on center bottom. Repeat for other side

Stitch from mark on side down to end of the fabric. Repeat for other side

For the outer purse, stitch the bottom seam (no opening needed) making sure the stitches from the embroidery will not show.

Checking after each seam makes it easier to remove stitches if needed. Ask me how I know :)

Stitch the side seams from the mark to the edge of the fabric on both sides

Know the Signs & Symptoms

- Abdominal bloating
- Feeling full quickly while eating

- Urinary urgency or frequency
- Changes in bowel habits
- Abnormal vaginal bleeding or discharge
- Back pain
- Unexplained weight gain or loss






ESIGNS IN MACHINE EMBROIDER

Working with a smaller hoop?

Print out the template and tape together.

Cut along the outer most line of the purse pattern

Use your embroidery software to remove the part of the design that is the purse pattern (Photo 2)

Purse design sizes with cutting and stitching lines removed:

Dainty Floral 198.1 x 111.3 Doves of Hope 184.1 x 105.1 Fresh Bouquet 184.1 x 109.4 Regal Floral 195.3 x 110.3








Putting it together:

Stabilize Mark the center of your design placement Hoop Embroider your designs (one for the front and one for the back.)





Line up the cross hairs of the embroidered design with the center marks on your template. Trace around the inside of the template on the front and back embroidered pieces. I did not do an embroidery on the lining, so I cut my lining pieces at the same. Cut out all your purse pieces








Transfer marks to lining and the purse front and back

Outer purse construction: Use your quarter inch foot and stitch outer purse bottom and side seams (No opening on the outer purse)

Lining: Stitch the lining bottom leaving an opening between the marks for turing right side out.

Stitch the side seams from the mark to the edge of the fabric.





Hint: Stitch from the cut edge into the project, pivot and stitch the rest of the seam(s).

When you get back to the other side of the opening, pivot and stitch out to the cut edge again.

When you go to turn your project the fabric knows right where to turn and looks great!



Creating the "box" corners:

Line up the bottom seam and the side seam and stitch 1/4" or if you have your stitching line from the embroidery, stitch just inside that line. Repeat for the other side, and for the lining corners.








Place the purse inside the lining right sides together. Pin together along the sides and top

Stitch








Be sure to start the stitching where your first stitches end. You will just need to maneuver your fabric under the needle to get it to line up.

Stitch all the way around until you reach the stitches on the other side.



Turn Right Side Out Press well Sew opening in the lining closed Top stitch a scant quarter in from the top edge



Get your purse clasp and glue (Aileen's Fabric Fusion Works GREAT!) Practice putting the purse in the clasp Run a bead of glue in the channel of one side of the clasp. Not too much or it will come out when you insert the purse



Insert the first side of your purse into the clasp channel

Pull your purse so it is tight but not stretched, and make sure it is pushed into the channel.

I found it easiest to maneuver the purse from the lining side, to avoid getting glue on the outer purse.

Hold in place for a few minutes.

Remove any excess glue with rubbing alcohol.

Let dry for at least 10 minutes then repeat for the next side.





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
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




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
