
How to get your designs where you want them





















Use your measurements to make it will fit on your project mark where you want the center of your design to be and stitch


6.02"(w)

3.51"(h)



Find the Center point of your design $6.02 \div 2 = 3.01$ (w) $3.51 \div 2 = 1.75$ (h)

Mark the center of your first design then measure out 6.02" to mark the placement for the second design, then out 6.02" for the next....until you have all the markings you need




Find the Center point of your design

Mark the center of your first design then measure out 7.02" to mark the placement for the second design, then out 7.02" for the next....until you have all the markings you need



































Design Placement


Placement Marks




Some designs come with placement/line up stitches.

These can be corner marks or in the center

Some softwares and machines have the ability to add these to your designs

Re-hoop and advance to the placement stitches that were previously stitched out.

If the needle does not line up with the already stitched placement stitches, move the design (on the screen) or the project until it is lined up correctly.



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
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

- Unexplained weight gain or loss





Elegant Evening Pashmina

Gather supplies listed in the supply list Follow the directions for preparing your fabric


Create a combination border design consisting of three equally spaced identical motifs.

This border design has a distinct top and bottom.

All of the spacing guidelines reference the center point of the design.

Use one of the methods presented on pages 7-11 for accurate alignment.

(Mathematically, Templates, Reference Points)






2. Hoop the fabric strip, keeping it centered lengthwise in the $5" \times 7"$ hoop. Notice the pin to the left, marking the top o the strip. To keep the design consistent, it is important to hoop the fabric with the pin on the eft for each of the three border designs. When embroidering each design, add a piece of lightweight tear-away underneath the hoop.



- 3. Transfer Wrapped01_01 to the machine. Stitch the first border motif in the center of the strip.
- 4. Stitch a second border motif, spacing it 8 1/2" to the right of the center motif. Stitch the third border motif spaced 8 12" to the left of the center motif. Hoop the fabric lengthwise each time, for a final combination of three equally spaced border designs. Make certain the pin is located on the left side when you re-hoop for each of these designs.





5. Remove the stabilizer and lightly press the band. Trim the band to 29" x 8", with the border motifs centered on the length and width of the band. Turn and press under 1/2" along each long edge. Pin the band in place 6" from the lower edge of the pashmina.

If you choose, you can adjust this measurement to suit your personal taste. Temporarily attach both bands by pinning them in place. Try on the wrap in front of a mirror and adjust if necessary.

6.. Set up your machine for sewing, and switch to the Microtex needle. Match your top thread to the silk and your bottom thread to the wrap. Turn under both short edges and pin in place. Stitch close to each short edge.





- 7. Select the ribbon for the top of the band. Pin so the outside edge of the trim just covers the folded edge of the fabric band. Tuck under excess trim at each short end, trimming as necessary. Then hand baste the ribbon over the long folded edge.
- 8. Repeat for the trim on the bottom edge of the band.
- 9. Change your top thread to match the ribbon. Machine stitch close to each edge of the 3/8" wide ribbon using a standard foot. Repeat for the bottom edge if you are using the same ribbon on both edges of the band.
- 10. To machine stitch beaded trim, switch to an adjustable zipper foot. Adjust the foot and sew close to the edge of the trim, taking care to secure the band to the wrap in the process.






Pashmina's and scarves come in a variety of sizes.

For this poncho you will want one where the fabric is about twice as long as it is wide, so when you cut it in half you will have two squares (36" X 72")







Place A on top of B right sides together Raw edge of A is in yellow Raw edge of B is in Green

Stitch together as indicated by white lines. Use a narrow seam or if you want you can use french seams.

The unstitched area is the area that will go over your head, so be sure to leave a large enough opening



The triangle area at the top will fold over to the front and back.

Finish these edges of the triangle areas as desired and enjoy your Poncho!






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
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
