- 1. Fabric
- 2. Stabilizer
- 3. Thread
- 4. Needles
- 5. Hoops





Lightweight Fabric, lightweight designs

Heavyweight fabric, almost all designs

Stabilizers

- Four Types:
- 1. Tear-Away
- 2. Wash-Away
- 3. Cut-Away
- 4. Film Toppers








How to Decide Thickness

Tear-Away – Layer Added



Wash-Away Clear Heavyweight for ITH Projects

In-the Hoop / Heavyweight



Perfect for decorative stitching, lace making and in-the-hoop projects. This stabilizer equals 4 layers of regular wash-away stabilizer. One layer will hold multiple stitches.

Does not gum up needles Bio-degradable Non -toxic








All the Templates in Place




Remove All but One Template

Slide it into the Machine






When the Machine Stops



Mishaps


- 1. White bobbin thread shows through Pens
- 2. Wrong color was embroidered
 - Go over it
 - Say it was planned that way
- 3. Want to add stabilizer
- 4. Forgot to use the wing needle
- 5. There are puckers around the design
- 6.The fabric slipped out of the hoop




